Staff to be reminded daily of the importance of social distancing both in the workplace and outside of it.		
Management checks to ensure this is adhered to.		
Taking steps to review work schedules including start & finish		
times/shift patterns, working from home etc. to reduce		
number of workers on site at any one time. Also relocating		
workers to other tasks.		
Limited learners and assessors to be on site at one time.		
Confirm with employers Covid-19 measures in place for our		
staff whilst visiting sites. If staff do not feel comfortable or		
employers have not put appropriate measures in place, staff		
can refuse to carry out learner visit/assessment.		
1 on 1 training and assessing to be implemented to ensure		
safety of all employees and candidates.		
Conference calls/video link to be used where possible instead		
of face to face meetings.		
Any training that can be completed using Zoom/Teams or		



other video conferencing to be used to ensure the safety of staff and learners.

Ensuring enough rest breaks for staff.

Regular breaks to be had to ensure washing of hands and change of PPE equipment is carried out.

Social distancing also to be adhered to in canteen areas and smoking areas at sites.

Standard practice to be followed of contacting employers prior to physically attending to monitor the present situation with employers and candidates in relation to signs of potential Covid. If Covid has been identified then no visit to take place.

Wearing of Gloves

Where Risk Assessment identifies wearing of gloves as a requirement of the job, an adequate supply of these will be provided. Staff will be instructed on how to remove gloves carefully to reduce contamination and how to dispose of them safely.

Staff to be reminded that wearing of gloves is not a substitute for good hand washing.

PPE

Public Health guidance on the use of PPE (personal protective equipment) to protect against COVID-19 relates to health care settings. In all other settings individuals are asked to observe social distancing measures and practice good hand hygiene behaviours

Where PPE is a requirement for risks associated with the work undertaken the following measures will be followed-



Face masks should always be worn when carrying out assessments with learners.

Disposable gloves always used.

Symptoms of Covid-19

If anyone becomes unwell with a new continuous cough or a high temperature in the workplace, or whilst visiting sites they will be sent home and advised to follow the stay at home guidance.


Line managers will maintain regular contact with staff members during this time.
